

Management Analysts

Overview

Conduct organizational studies and evaluations, design systems and procedures, conduct work simplification and measurement studies, and prepare operations and procedures manuals to assist management in operating more efficiently and effectively. Includes program analysts and management consultants.

Education Required

Work experience, plus a bachelor's or higher degree: Occupations at this level generally require work experience in an occupation requiring a bachelor's or higher degree. Most occupations in this category are managerial occupations that require experience in a related non-managerial position.

Money/Salary

The median annual wage for management analysts was \$80,880 in 2014, according to the BLS. The highest-paid in the field made \$148,110 per year, while the bottom 10 percent earned \$45,360. The best-paying jobs for consultant work are in Greeley, Colorado; Pittsfield, Massachusetts; and Naples, Florida.

Job Outlook

The BLS reports that employment of management analysts is expected to grow by 22% through 2020, which is faster than the 14% average growth rate projected for all occupations over the same period. Growth will occur as organizations continue to seek ways to reduce costs and improve productivity.
